Course Description: This class consists of two distinct courses: Economics and Government. Each course is taught over a 9 week period. Economics focuses on the student's role as a consumer, making choices based on limited resources. The Government course introduces students to the basic functions of the American government and the student's role as a citizen. Both courses are required for graduation.

In addition, we will integrate elements of Personal Finance into each unit of the Economics course. As a result, students will receive an addition 0.5 credit for Personal Financial Literacy. This grade will match your Economics grade; there will not be additional assignments or grades to receive this credit.
